California State University (CSU) Testing Policy

The California State University (CSU) has temporarily suspended the use of ACT/SAT examinations in determining admission eligibility for all CSU campuses for the 2021-2022 academic year. This temporary change of admission eligibility applies only for fall 2021, winter 2022, spring 2022, fall 2022, winter 2023, and spring 2023 admission cycles.

What does this mean?

This means that SAT and ACT scores will not be used for determining who gets admitted into the CSU. If you are accepted to a CSU campus, ACT or SAT test scores will be used as one of the measures to place you in the proper mathematics and English courses.

University of California (UC) Testing Policy

UC will not consider SAT or ACT test scores when making admissions decisions or awarding scholarships. If you choose to submit test scores as part of your application, they may be used as an alternative method of fulfilling minimum requirements for eligibility or for course placement after you enroll.

Will not submitting an SAT/ACT test score hurt my chances of being admitted?

No. Test scores are not considered for admission decisions.

Private Colleges/Universities Testing Policy

Most private schools are test optional for the Fall 2022 semester. Each private school runs a bit differently therefore, it is recommended that you are checking the website of each private institution you plan on applying to to determine their testing policy.

What does this mean?

This means that students may submit their test score if they believe it will enhance their application. Students who opt to not send test scores will not be at a disadvantage.
