

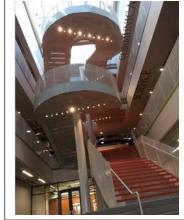

# ADVISORY: UNDERSTANDING DIFFERENCES

### BIZOUGHT TO YOU BY FIZANK, MS. MUTZATALLA, MS. KONDO, MIZ. WIMETZ, MS. LIANG & MS. HETZNANDEZ

GOAL: TO REMIND STUDENTS THAT REGARDLESS OF WHAT A PERSON'S IDENTITY IS THEY ARE STILL A HUMAN BEING AND WE SHOULD TREAT EACH OTHER AS SO.

- 1. GO THROUGH THE PPT (WITH TERMS ON THEM) HAVE STUDENTS WRITE (F) OR (M) FOR THE GENDER THEY THOUGHT OF WHEN HEARING/SEEING THE TERM ON THE PPT.
- 2.Watch "Like A Girl" and "The Mask You Live In"
- 3. HAVE STUDENTS SILENTLY ANSWER THE PROMPTED QUESTIONS:
  - **A)** What is wrong with assuming specific jobs or things are designated for specific people?
  - B) WHAT ARE THE ISSUES WITH USING "LIKE A GIRL" STATEMENTS- SUCH AS "YOU RUN LIKE A GIRL" STOP BEING A LITTLE GIRL".ETC.?
  - C) WHAT ARE THE ISSUES WITH USING STATEMENTS SUCH AS "BE A MAN"?
  - **D)** HAVE YOU EVER USED THESE TERMS TOWARDS A FRIEND/SIBLING/RELATIVE?
  - E) HAVE THESE STATEMENTS EVER BEEN USED TOWARDS YOU? HOW DID IT MAKE YOU FEEL?
- 4. THE FOLLOWING IS UP TO ADVISOR:
- Use the questions answered above to discuss and reflect.
- 2. COUNCIL TIME (WITH ANY/ALL OF THE QUESTIONS ABOVE)

GOALS: (1) HAVE STUDENTS UNDERSTAND THE PERSPECTIVE AND EXPERIENCE OF A PERSON WITH AUTISM AND (2) EXPLORE WAYS WE CAN SUPPORT PEOPLE WITH AUTISM

- ) <u>Slide 1</u>: Ask students what these people have in common. When you click it will show an animation that states that all these people have been diagnosed with autism, some posthumously.
- 2) <u>SLIDE 3</u>: STATED ARE EXAMPLES OF STRUGGLES THAT PEOPLE WITH AUTISM MAY STRUGGLE WITH. REMIND STUDENTS THAT PEOPLE WITH AUTISM MAY, TO VARYING DEGREES, HAVE SOME OR ALL OF THESE TRAITS.
- B)<u>SLIDE 5</u> (ACTIVITY): In this activity (materials will be in your boxes) students must be in groups of five (5).
- PERSON 1: PLAY SOMEONE WITH AUTISM TRYING TO ANSWER PERSON #5

  PERSON 2: STAND BEHIND AND TAP #1 ON NECK W/INDEX CARD

  PERSON 3: READ EXCERPT #1 LOUDLY RIGHT NEXT TO PERSON #1

  PERSON 4: PAT ON SHOULDER REPEATEDLY (GENTLY!)

#### Person 5: read excerpt #2 & ask questions to Person #1
