

About half a million immigrants went through Angel Island, many from Asian countries (China, Japan, South Asia). People were treated differently based on their nationality. If you know the name Cesar Chavez, you should also know the name <u>Larry</u> <u>Itliong</u>. Larry Itliong was a farm laborer and labor organizer for the Agricultural Workers Organizing Committee who contacted Cesar Chavez (National Farm Workers Association) to ask Mexican farm workers to join Filipinos in the Delano Grape Strike. The strike lasted for 5 years and the groups merged to become the <u>United Farm Workers</u> (UFW).



A <u>study</u> reports the AAPI community is under represented in film. AAPI represents 7.1% of the population and only 3.4% of the 1300 top grossing films in the past 13 years had an AAPI lead or co-lead. In 2018 and 2019, if an AAPI did have a role, 74.7% were minor characters who spoke five lines or less. In 2019 the roles that AAPI played were mostly sidekicks or villains, stereotyped, died by the end of the end of the film or died violently. Representation matters.
